





Diabetes and COVID 19

KNOW About COVID-19!

Covid-19 is coronavirus that can be transmitted from one to another [infectious disease]. Older people, and the people living with Diabetes [PLWD] and other non communicable diseases [PLWNCDs] are more prone to develop this illness.





Q1: Are PLWD more likely to get Covid-19?

Yes, due to the reduced immunity (resisitance) in their bodies to fight with virus.

Non Modifiable:

- 1. Immunodeficiency: Immune system dysfunction in people with diabetes is thought to make these individuals more susceptible to infections.
- 2.Advanced age group
- 3.Diabetes with associated complications

Modifiable:

Lack of drug compliance, Unbalanced/ unhealthy diet, Physical inactivity, Mental stress, Financial difficulties

Q2. What can happen to a PLWD if you get the virus?

They can experience serious complications unlike a person without any illness

Q3. Are the risks same for T1D and T2D?

Yes, depending on the degree of control and the resisitance to infection.

How to mitigate the risk?

Lack of drug compliance

Attention to details of treatment

Unbalanced/ unhealthy diet

A balanced and healthy diet

Physical inactivity

Be physically active. (Engage in exercises at least 30min a day for at least 5days a week.)

Mental stress

Engage in leisure activities and build good communication and rapport with family members. Avoid stressful situations

Financial difficulties.

Adopt low cost living condition

Unsung heros of #savealifecovid19: Young Leaders heroic expedition during the lockdown

Covid -19 didn't spare Sri Lanka. In February, the first patient was a migrant worker from China who recovered and left the country. As the virus raised its head, the Government of Sri Lanka imposed an Island wide curfew the locking entire country down on 20th March 2020.

The National Diabetes Centre Rajagiriya, headquarters of the Diabetes Association of Sri Lanka has more than 700 young persons registered with type 1 [PLWT1D] Diabetes 350 of whom receive insulin, meters strips, laboratory tests and medical guidance free of charge on a regular basis. They underpriviledged unable to bear out of pocket expenses to buy insulin in the private sector pharmacies.



Week into the lock down, we got calls from our registrants that they couldn't access their needs from the government hospitals. On further investigation, it transpired that the free health system that we enjoy had exhausted its reserves of this vital medication.

It was Dhanuka Dilshan better known as Vikasith, a young leader in diabetes [YLD] who received training in Busan at the IDF World Congress in December 2019, who informed us of this serious situation. Vikasith contacted with another YLD who was trained as an advocate and a voice of change by NCDA Geneva at the "Our Views Our Voices "programme in June 2019. They along with our staff immediately dedicated accessed our data base, telephone each PLWT1D to ascertain their insulin stocks. Thereafter our staff the **YLDs** packed individualized requirement for over 100 youngsters, obtained special permission by the Ministry of Health and the Inspector General of Police deliveries arrange home islandwide. Thi<mark>s herculean task was</mark> undertaken on his own motor cycle where he and Dinuka Jude started the delivery chain to T1D in and around the capital city on consecutive days.

Unsung Heroes 2020

As casualty and death toll rose, so did fear which overcame Jude's family which prevented him from continuing #Savealifecovid-19.

Vikasith took over the responsibility single handedly undeterred and continued the tiresome daily run in a hired vehicle travelling over 2000 km over 4 days to far away districts. It was amazing to see his courage, and his genuine enthusiasm to help others just like him. It was indeed joyful to see his smiling face every morning ready to start another grueling day of travel. We thank Gemunu who drove him around with equal enthusiasm in a coordinated effort to help others in need during this unprecedented lockdown. These are the unsung heroes of the #Covid-19SL. It took intense coordination and planning. It was exhausting as they needed to cross borders on a daily basis. Long hours and 2000 km later, their bravery and risking their own lives as persons@risk for others in need, saved the lives of over 100 young T1D who couldn't leave their homes due to this situation. We are proud of our Young leaders in Diabetes and advocates of NCDs.




" Voice from the Heart of PLWTID" – Support in an hour of need
